An Island Wide Cyber Security Risk Assessment is being undertaken to provide insight into Jersey's cyber security maturity, help businesses improve their resilience and to support Government's cyber security strategy with relevant policy initiatives.



Why now?

The last Island Wide Cyber Risk Assessment was conducted in 2015. This informed Jersey's first Cyber Security strategy, published in 2017, which aims to ensure that Jersey remains a safe place to live and work especially as more transactions move online.

What's in it for your business?

Demonstrate to your costumers that you are committed to improving your cyber security. Participating organisations will be assessed against the National Institute Standards Technology (NIST) Cyber Security Framework and will receive a detailed report with tailored advice on how to improve resilience and comparison with the average scores for similar businesses.

The £300 cost of Cyber Essentials Certification will be offered to 50 randomly selected businesses.



Working in partnership

Certified by the UK National Cyber Security Centre, Actica Consulting has been commissioned to complete the Island Wide Cyber Security Risk Assessment on behalf of Government.



Privacy will be protected

The Government of Jersey will not have access to the detailed information submitted and will only receive anonymised and aggregated findings from Actica Consulting. Actica Consulting will not pass any data to third parties and all data will be erased within six months of the project ending.
